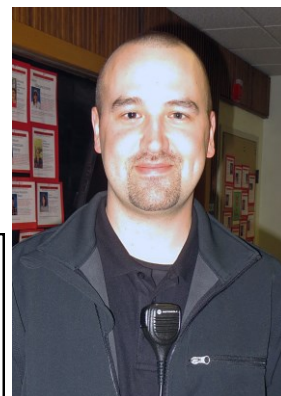

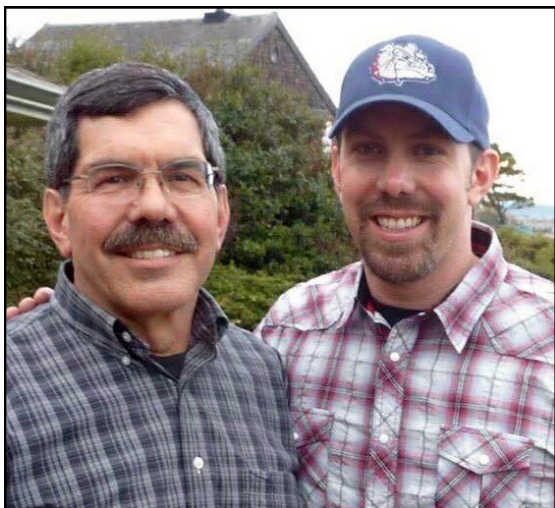

Congratulations to PTHS Senior Track & Field athlete Seren Dances for being named WIAA 1A athlete of the week! Dances opened the season with league wins in the 100m hurdles (16.05 seconds), 200m (23.46 seconds), and long jump (22'2.75 feet) on 3/23. Two days later at the Lewis County Invitational, he placed second in the 100m (11.76 seconds) and first place in the 4x100m relay and 300m hurdles (40.06 seconds). Additional congratulations to Seren for breaking Tom Owsley's 1981 PTHS long jump record by 9 inches, with a leap of 22'4".

4/15/17 update: Seren Dances set a new school record in the Triple Jump of 45' 0.25". This bested Bryan Johnson's record of 44' 11.5" set in 1983.

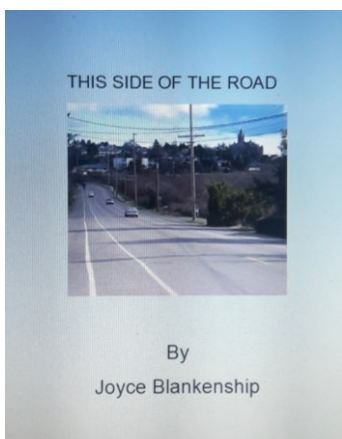

The Lincoln Building

The Lincoln Building is used now for storage, so my co-worker at PTHS, Lisa Anderson, and I go there every few months to find treasures for the high school. On this particular day, I wanted to explore the 3rd floor to rekindle memories of my days there as a student. After leaving Mr. Baker's 5th grade classroom, we walked down the spacious hallway and entered Mrs. Copps' 6th grade class. I walked over to the chalkboard, and as I did a memory came flooding back loud and clear.

It was during a class meeting and my best friend, Mary Burns Fredeen, was the sergeant-at-arms. I evidently spoke out of turn because the next thing I knew, my name was written on the chalkboard, but was spelled incorrectly. I was called then by my full name of "Janet", but she wrote "Jamit" on the board. She took her job seriously because each time I tried to tell her that my name was spelled wrong, she put a check mark beside my name. Each check mark meant I had to write, "I will not talk in class meetings" that many more times. I remember that evening writing that sentence over and over again, hundreds of times. I finally did get that laborious task completed and ended up with blisters on my fingers from the pencil. That is my strongest memory from that classroom - and Mary and I are still BFFs!

I have wonderful vivid memories of the Lincoln Building. Mrs. McCoy in 3rd Grade was such a firm, but excellent teacher. We learned our multiplication tables. At Open House that year Mrs. McCoy told my parents I was doing well in my work, but that I was a bit of a tattler. My Mom told me that when we got home, and I remember being stunned....and thought, "I better quit doing that." Mrs. Morton was 4th Grade, again a firm teacher with high standards for our behavior and learning. I saw her laugh out loud only a couple of times. Mr. Earl was my 5th Grade teacher. We made marionettes from characters in history (I made Dolly Madison) and created little plays. He was strict and got us organized after a few months with 3 ring

notebooks, dividers, and no more monkey business. He had us in rows, then put us in a horse shoe. Everyday was a big learning adventure. I had Mrs. Copps in 6th grade. She was quiet, but firm. No funny business with her. I was getting a little too "social & silly" and she had to put me in my place. We learned so much about countries around the world that year. Like Dodie Christiansen, I really remember the Safety Patrol gear in the basement. I was so proud to be on Safety Patrol and loved going for our free day at the carnival in May. I was in the girls bathroom, being cool and sitting on the sink one day. A teacher walked in and said, "How would you like me to come to your house and sit on your sink like that?" That left a huge impression....We played horses on the lower field and Troll Dolls on the rockery. We played 7-Up on the brick wall, and Chinese Jump Rope. Medielaine DePouli and I made miniature people out of paper and had them housed in our lift top desks in 3rd grade. I remember being very intimidated by the Principal's Office, and always worried about the kids that were in trouble behind the closed door. I remember going over to the high school cafeteria for lunch and ice cream bars and seeing couples in the hall, hugging and kissing, and holding hands. This made a big impression and it was hard to keep from gawking. Awe, those youthful years were great....but I know we had sad and lonely times, too. We were out on the playground (my 3rd grade year) when we heard about President Kennedy. Lincoln Building....this was the time our strong friendships began.

From Peter Frary:

I loved those rustic oak and wrought iron desks sporting ink wells and trap door storage. Even in the 1960s I knew they were from a bygone era. And sitting on the steam radiators was oh so comfy on a cold PT morning. Finally, I remember playing tetherball in the yard with Kris Logue before class!

From Cheri Fritz:

I remember catching a softball in the eye. Quite a shiner, lol. Funny thing about it was I was playing tether ball and the softball came from the lower field. Someone had a great arm! Lol

From Eric DeWeese:

I remember lots of chess with Mr. Phil Rich.

From Ivert Mayhugh:

I spent 3rd, 4th, and 5th grades in the Lincoln School during the years 1944 thru 1947. I remember more from 5th grade and Miss Avery than any of the other classes. Miss Avery was tough. Always preaching the importance of eating the right foods, drinking milk and keeping bedroom windows open when you sleep. She would often ask what we had for breakfast. Smart kids lied to avoid criticism. Ms. King, a wonderful artist taught my 4th grade and I believe my 3rd grade teacher was Ms. Mather. I got in trouble once for kicking a classroom door that would not stay open. Some things you never forget.

From Dodie Christiansen:

I remember Safety Patrol outfits hanging in the basement and the movie room with the projector. I was afraid to go down to the lower field to play because of the steep hill, and I believe it was Diane Hoffman, who ran down the hill and fell, skinning up her knees really bad. Also remember playing with troll dolls along the rockery and playing Chinese jump rope and 4 square and dodge ball. My favorite teacher was Mr. Earl He was an amazing teacher for me. I couldn't understand math, and he would always help me with math problems, and he would have patience to go over and over and over until I finally understood how to solve the problem.

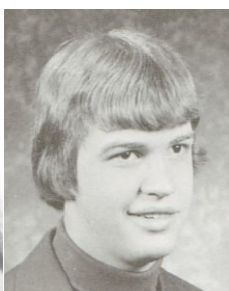

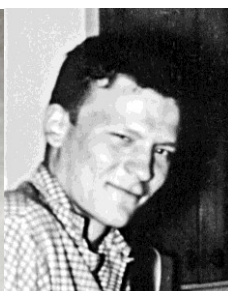
