He applies lessons from these and other past struggles to such pressing contemporary issues as the rights of sexual minorities and the homeless, racism in the criminal justice system, police brutality, voting restrictions, oppressive measures against migrants, and more." What is the Port Townsend Education Foundation?

The Port Townsend Education Foundation (PTEF) was founded over ten years ago in response to the financial challenges faced by teachers of the Port Townsend School District when seeking to provide enrichment or enhance academic achievement in the classroom. PTEF has raised nearly \$400,000 over the past ten years for curriculum-based learning projects. These projects have ranged from iPads in math classes to stream restoration and laser equipment for the high school robotics program.

This all-volunteer organization, comprised of dedicated parents, business owners and community members, undertakes a thorough evaluation of proposed projects submitted by teachers each year, prioritizing and funding as many qualified projects as resources allow.

In 2017 these were just a few of the over 30 grants funded by PTEF:

- PSAT funding for all 11th Graders
- Honors World History Library
- Preschool Motor Development Equipment
- Expanded Science Technology
- Engineering Day Field Trip and Exposition
- Coast Guard Licensing Curriculum
- Writers in the Schools
- Tales, Text & Theater
- Maritime Discovery

Holley Carlson, PTEF past-president, says, "when I walk in a classroom and know that without PTEF there would be no 4th and 5th grade art classes, no iPads at Grant Street, no essential high school science tools, no community garden and fewer dollars toward environmental restoration projects, it makes me so grateful for the support of the community that makes these things possible."

Nifty Fifties business owner and PTHS alumni, Omar Santos

is participating in one of the many opportunities to support academic enrichment in the Port Townsend School District. Port Townsend Education Foundation has over the past 10 years distributed over \$400,000.00 in grant awards to the school district through awarded grants. Along with their annual fundraising event, you will find change jars in our local downtown businesses.



Rather than waiting for customers to fill the change jars located at the register, the service staff decided to contribute all of their daily coin tips into the jar. Waitstaff, Katie Edie, explained that when tip ownership was in question they determined to put those tips in along with the coin tips received each day. This is no small gesture when one considers that tips are a significant portion of a day's wage. Tipping the hat to Omar Santos and his staff at Nifty Fifties!

Through the efforts of our board members and volunteers, PTEF seeks funds to benefit our schools through direct solicitation of community members, corporate sponsorships, and with fundraising events. PTEF seeks to allocate funds as they are raised each year; this year \$45,000 in grants were awarded on October 5. While PTEF is pleased to be able to provide this support, as more teachers see how these grant projects not only increase student engagement but objectively improve student outcomes, the number of high-quality grant requests has begun to far outstrip PTEF's ability to support. Over \$30,000 in requests went unfunded during this year's grant cycle.

PTEF is hoping to double previous fundraising efforts in the coming year in order to help meet the need for greater support in the classrooms. You can help in a number of ways! Current and upcoming fundraising efforts include:

I attended the Primary Building (now Gael Stuart) and the Lincoln School, but spent many hours at Grant Street when my kids were there in the 80s, as a room mom, classroom volunteer, and finally a paraeducator when I was hired in 1986.

Our opinion was that the building was well past its time to come down, and we were excited that there was a brand new school under construction that would, in time, hold special memories for those attending, just as Grant Street had.



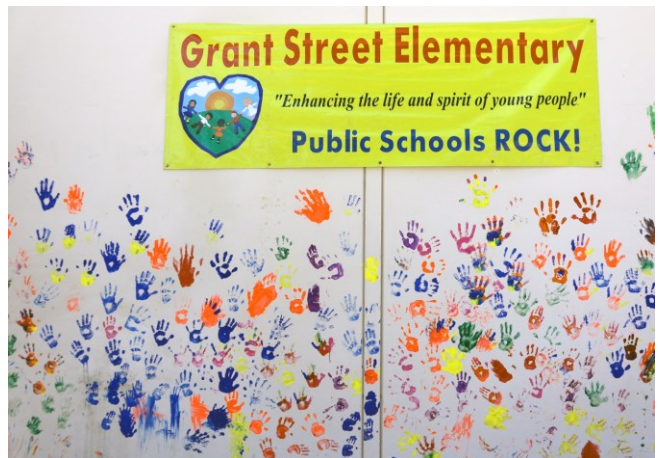

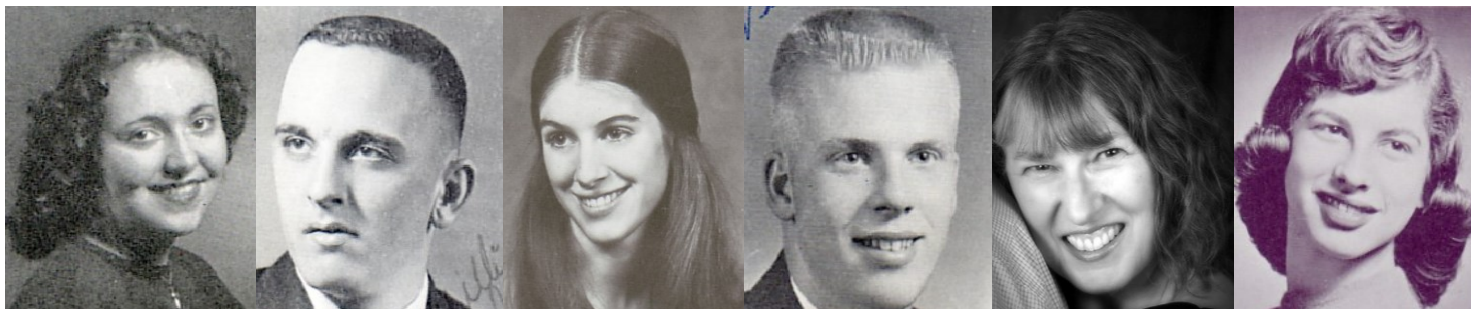

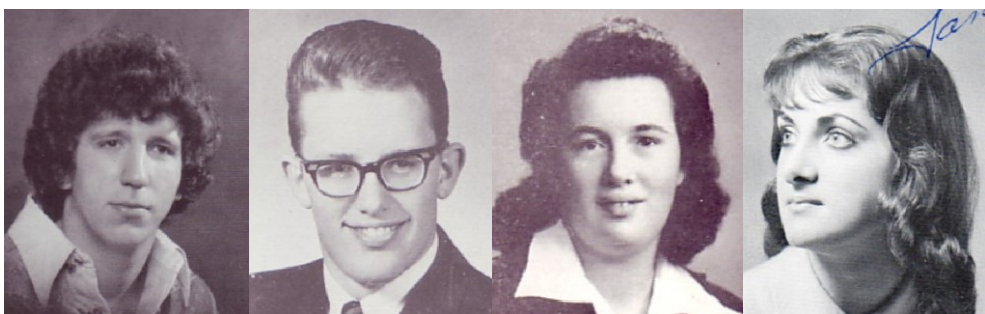
